

# Redbourn Junior School

## PE Premium Report 2017 – 2018

The PE and sport premium is designed to help primary schools improve the quality of the PE and sport activities they offer their pupils. The government has spent over £450 million on this funding over 4 academic years 2013 to 2017. The funding has now been extended to 2020. Redbourn Junior Schools Sports Premium for 2017/18 is £9195.

### Current Provision:

- Pupils at Redbourn Junior School benefit from the expertise of a dedicated sports coach, who teaches every class games once per week.
- Extra-curricular clubs – a wide range of clubs are offered to pupils in all year groups
- Inter-school competitions – Pupils participate in a variety of inter-school competitions within the Harpenden consortium of schools.
